- 4. To start and run job oriented training centers, such as handicrafts, small scale industries etc.
- 5. To facilitate and encourage the members and the local community in the fields of arts and music.
- 6. To start activities to promote socio-economic development of women, youth and elderly people.
- 7. To undertake all types of research activities including handicrafts.
- 8. To undertake all nutrition programs in various rural colonies for women and children in need.





- 9. To organize health camps, rural water supply, sanitation, and environment protection, Ecology in order to uplift the rural and urban poor.
- 10. To do all lawful acts and things in accordance with the spirit of the Constitution of India.
- 11. To introduce adult education and to run classes for slum dwellers and unorganized labourers.
- 12. To conduct national days / festivals like Republic Day, Ambedkar Jayanthi, Independence Day, Children's Day, Kannada Rajyothsava, Basava Jayanthi, Id-Milad, Christmas, Gurunanak day etc.
- 13. To introduce village industries, handicraft training for women, start job oriented courses such as tailoring, embroidery dress making, fashion design, interior decoration, hotel management, computer training etc.

## a. SHG Group Training

A life of dignity is the right of every citizen. Poverty is an obstruction to a dignified life. Self employment is a significant step to have sustained incomes and remove the shackles of poverty.

continue to promote, nurture and capacitate a number of Self Help Groups for





Women and inculcate saving habits in them. Continuous efforts are undertaken for the capacity building of these SHGs, to increase their ability to function independently with minimum support from outside. These SHGs are formed with the objective of empowering local communities which will enable them to take decisions concerning their own economic development. The groups are trained on planning, book keeping, financial management, conflict management and take up humanitarian activities. Regular trainings and exposure visits to other SHG initiatives are undertaken to encourage self-reliance and sustainability.

Sagar Education and Development Society (SEDS) interact with rural and urban women to build awareness on various issues which they are facing and ways and means by which they can overcome them. It leads to introduction of SHG where women inculcate a habit of saving, have availability of finances in an emergency as well as for need — based requirements.

Leading Yourself, Leading Others, Leading the Community This interactive training develops the leadership of youth participants to create positive change in their communities. In addition to learning about leadership styles and effective group collaboration, participants will understand how to put their leadership skills to use.

- Students feel empowered as leaders to make change in their communities.
- Students build community with other students.
- Students can identify and address the root causes of issues in their communities.
- Students set goals and determine how to measure success of their service experiences.

SEDS trained over 150 rural youth, reached 30 villages in Sagar







## c. World Environment Day

Sagar Education Development Society (SEDS) every year World organizing Environment Day on June 5<sup>th</sup> a day set aside since 1974 to worldwide promote for awareness and action of protection our environment. Our organization's main vision is:



A prosperous, harmonious safe environment and peaceful Society.

Activities: We organized workshop based on the theme of the year **"Beat Plastic Pollution"**. The students were made aware of the ill effects of using plastic caused to both mother earth and human race. The students extensively deliberated on this issue and



got motivated to find different ways to eradicate the use of plastics. They decided to speak about it and create awareness starting with their own homes and in the neighborhood community. We conducted the environment issues, and challenges debate, competition and at the end of the day we distributed prize to the winners.

## d. International Rural Women's Day

International Day of Rural Women is observed every year on 15<sup>th</sup> October to recognize the crucial role and contribution of rural women. The 2018 theme of the day *"Sustainable infrastructure, services and social protection for gender equality and the empowerment of rural women and girls"* was taken up for discussion and deliberations.





Education and Development Sagar (SEDS) for Society working empowering the rural women. celebrated October 15th 2018 bv organizing one day program for Self Help Group women and conducted games, cultural activities, and theme based session, debate and discussion, wherein 75 of them from Sagar actively participated. On the whole it was a rewarding and rejoicing day for the women.



## e. World Food Day

World Food Day is a day of action dedicated to tackling global hunger. Held annually on 16th October, people from around the world come together to declare their commitment to eradicate worldwide hunger from our lifetime.

SagarEducationandDevelopmentSociety(SEDS) organizedthe theme ofWorldFoodDay2017: "Change the



*future of migration: Invest in food security and rural development".* One day workshop focused on organic SEEDS exhibition, session about migration and food security; nearly 110 participants took active part in this workshop.





## f. Computer Training

Importance of digital literacy in education helps students to learn things around the world besides book knowledge. People can learn organic farming, health precautions, and very especially Govt. of India has initiated E-PANCHAYAT MISSION to improve quality of governance in rural areas.

Technical education has already transformed millions of lives in India and is fuelling economic growth across all its sectors. But still there are several pockets of rural youth left behind by the technological revolution and where the modernization of the education system is still a fancy dream. It is not that students here lack the willingness to study; what they do not receive is the opportunity to study and the availability of quality yet affordable educational resources.

#### **Our Goals and Objectives:**

- To reduce unemployment in the rural area through self-employment/ employment.
- To train rural youth so that they can earn their livelihood easily in their own village. This prevents mass migration to cities.
- To promote a culture of Information
  Technology and introduce it as a



career option to rural youth.

• To build a network of grassroots-level organizations across Karnataka promote Rural Computer Literacy.

Sagar Education and Development Society (SEDS) focuses on empowerment of the rural youth. SEDS through its computer education center in Jog Falls





this year extended its free coaching classes for 15 days for high school students also 180 village people get benefited, in that 80 students got Job in Bangalore.

## g. Tailoring Training

*National Skill Development Mission* was approved by the Union Cabinet in 2015 on the occasion of **World Youth Skills Day.** The Mission has been developed to create convergence across sectors and states in terms of skill training activities.

People at low education levels have little chances of securing a job in the formal sector; they are looking for options to generate income to sustain their families. Local communities especially the rural women, find themselves inept at supporting their family due to absence of any professional skill. Women have always been marginalized and downgraded to the



status of subjugated class in the Rural and semi urban areas . Due to lack of specific implementation of plans, local communities especially women have remained outside the scope and benefits of government schemes and programs. Women have not actively participated in their emancipation due to their lack of economic independence and illiteracy in Rural Area . There is a need to address the issue by raising the status of women. Keeping this issue in mind SEDS started running training programs for the empowerment of women.





Sagart Education and Development Society (SEDS) since many years is running Tailoring Training Center. One of the core objectives of empowerment is on skill enhancement and employability of the target village people. Successful training interventions will address the skill demands which derive from the specific socio-cultural and economic environment with a focus on the need to participate in economic and social processes. The programs need to be designed to have high local relevancy and in-built flexibility. Due to poverty, these teenage girls drop out of high school to get married and work as temporary farm workers, sweepers and manual scavengers. They needed to learn newer vocational skills such as tailoring and embroidery (sewing) which can help them earn more income and become economically selfsufficient and independent. This will alleviate poverty, help them support their family needs without being dependent on husband and parents. In order to help them, SEDS started tailoring (sewing) training centers in various locations. This year 103 Students are got benefited in that. 55 women's start their own self income work and 15 women's got job in various company other 33 are looking for Job.

#### Awareness on status of women in rural areas:

It is encouraging to note the pro active step taken by SEDS to sensitize its rural women beneficiaries on the prevailing situation of women folks. It is deeply concerned that an estimated 50,000 female fetuses are aborted each



month, which has led to a steep in the child sex ratio in India in the age group



of 0-6 years, from 976 girls per 1000 boys in 1961 to 919 girls in 2011. This huge imbalance between the number of girls and boys in our population is further fueling violence against women and girls in our communities.

The primary factor behind the declining child sex ratio is triggered and accelerated by a social system that attaches a higher value for sons over daughters.

As members of SEDS

- That violence against women and girl child especially stands in direct contrast to the teachings in religious texts and traditions.
- The dignity and worth of all girls and women and their fundamental right to life and liberty.
- Religious belief and traditions have often been strongly used to perpetuate violence and discrimination against girls and women and has even led to the practice of gender biased sex selective abortion.

We pledge to:

- 1. Honour and respect girls and women and will strive to ensure that sex-selective abortions are not conducted in our families and among our friends.
- 2. To stand up for girls and women in our families to have equal share in the resources of the family including their legal inheritance.
- 3. To stand with women and girls as they exercise their fundamental rights and freedoms guaranteed under the constitution of India.
- 4. To recognize that men and women deserve equal respect and opportunities in our families, place of work and in society.
- 5. To ensure that women and girls enjoy equal protection of the law.
