11. To introduce adult education and to run classes for slum dwellers and unorganized laborers.

Activities of the year

Activities and programs are integral part of the organization. Here we would like to put down the activities and programs of Sagara Education Development Society for the year. All these programs had been organized by the expertise of its members and volunteers under the leadership and guidance of the board members of SEDS.



Nammane Rural Girls Children Home:

Nammane Rural Girls Children Home provides comprehensive care to children from remote villages in the Sharavathi Valley Sanctuary area, including Sagar, Linganamakki, Jog, and Kargal. We are committed to ensuring the children's rights to education and overall well-being. Below is an overview of the various programs and activities organized by Nammane Children's Home throughout 2023.

New Admission for Nammane Children's Home

Children from different villages have been admitted to Nammane Children's Home. We accepted applications and selected children who were facing difficulties in accessing education,



particularly those who had to walk 3 to 10 km through wildlife forests to reach school. We also prioritized children from single-parent families. A total of 18 new children were admitted to Nammane.



New English Teacher Appointment

A new English teacher, Ms. Manasa, has been appointed at Nammane Children's Home. She is an M.Com graduate and conducts English classes every day. Her lessons cover grammar, verbs, sentence formation, and spoken English, aiming to enhance the children's language skills.



1st Nammane Children's Parents Meeting (2023-2024)

The Nammane Parents Meeting was held on 2nd July 2023 at the Nammane premises. During the meeting, several programs took place, including a birthday celebration for both the children and staff.



English Conversation: Children discussed the programs of the previous month and their ongoing learning activities.

New Stewardship Introduction: The new stewardship was introduced, and Mrs. Selvi Gomes was appointed as the new steward.

Police Officer Visit: Mr. Harish, a police officer, visited and interacted with the children.



Health and Cleanliness: Nurses and ASHA workers visited the home, and KPC organized cleanliness efforts on the premises.

Wheelchair Distribution

Under the leadership of Mr. Santhosh, the Founder of Nammane Children's Home, and with the generous support of Goodera, a wheelchair distribution event was organized in Kargal. The initiative was aimed at providing mobility assistance to elderly and disabled individuals who faced significant challenges in their daily lives due to limited mobility.

The Nammane team, along with local dignitaries and community



members, identified eight needy individuals in the Kargal area who were struggling with walking and mobility. These individuals, many of whom were elderly, were in desperate need of assistance to improve their quality of life. The distribution took place in a warm and heartening ceremony, where wheelchairs were handed over to each recipient.

This event not only brought relief to the elderly and disabled community members but also highlighted the importance of support and care for the marginalized sections of society. The event was



attended by Nammane staff, dignitaries, and local volunteers, all of whom worked together to make the occasion a success.

The distribution of wheelchairs has had a profound impact on the lives of the recipients, giving them the freedom to move around more easily and safely. This initiative, which embodies Nammane's commitment to improving the lives of vulnerable communities, is a testament to the positive change that can come from collective action and generosity.

Ration Kit Distribution to Underprivileged Families

Sponsored by Goodera, the kits included essential food items like rice, chili powder, turmeric, salt, and toor dal, providing much-needed nutrition to families facing financial difficulties.



The distribution was led by Mr. Santhosh, the founder of Nammane Children's Home, with the support of staff and volunteers. The recipients were selected based on their need, and the initiative aimed to alleviate food insecurity in vulnerable communities.

New Home Mother Appointment

Mrs. Hemavathi was appointed as the new Home Mother and Cook on 4th September, replacing Mrs. Sudha who left due to unavoidable reasons. Mrs. Hemavathi brings experience from working in various hostels.



Solar Lamp Distribution

Solar lamps were distributed in the hamlets of Kanapagaru and Kanuru. This initiative, led by Mr. Santhosh and Nammane staff, aimed to support children in remote areas where electricity is scarce.

Kitchen Garden Maintenance and Cleanliness Drive

This month, the staff and children of Nammane Children's Home worked together to clean and maintain the kitchen garden, fostering environmental awareness and sustainability. The team removed garbage, dead plants, and debris, creating a healthier space for the plants to thrive.



The children actively participated in the clean-up, learning about cleanliness, waste disposal, recycling, and sustainability. They also cared for the garden by watering plants, trimming growth, and ensuring the soil stayed fertile. The garden, which provides fresh produce for the home's kitchen, plays a key role in promoting self-sufficiency.

Through this hands-on experience, the children learned about organic farming and the importance of growing their own food. The

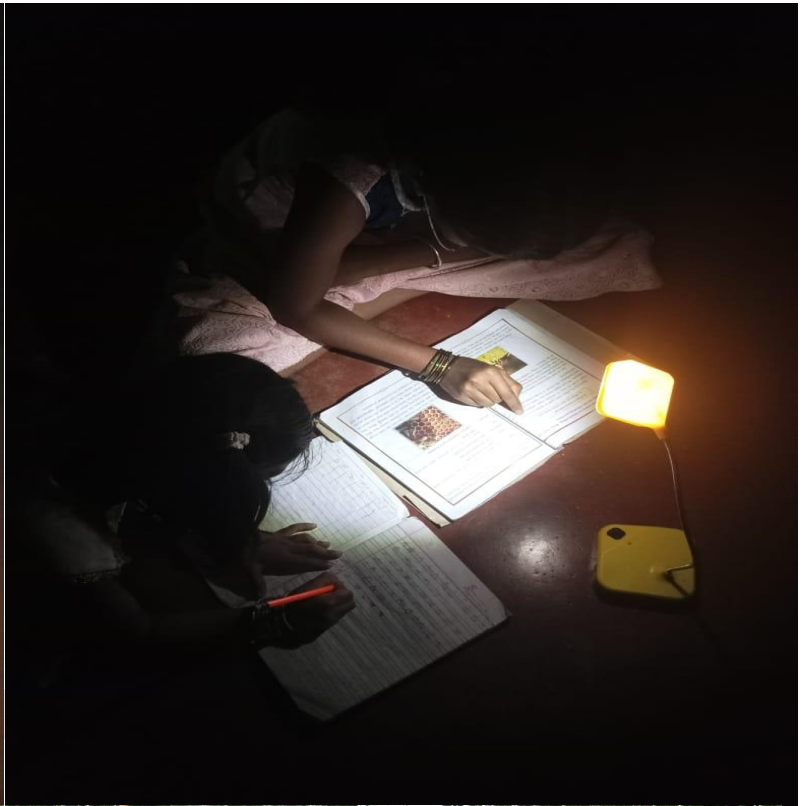
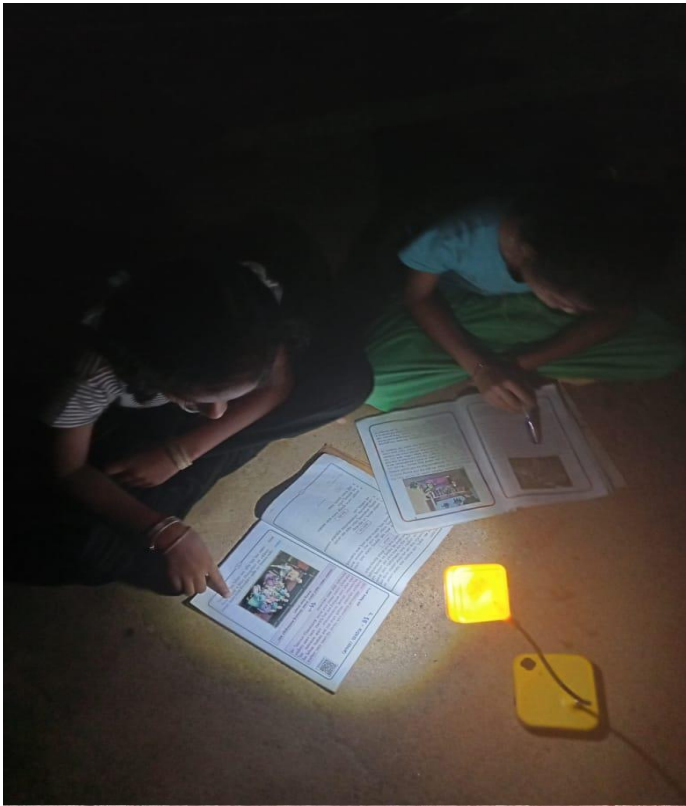

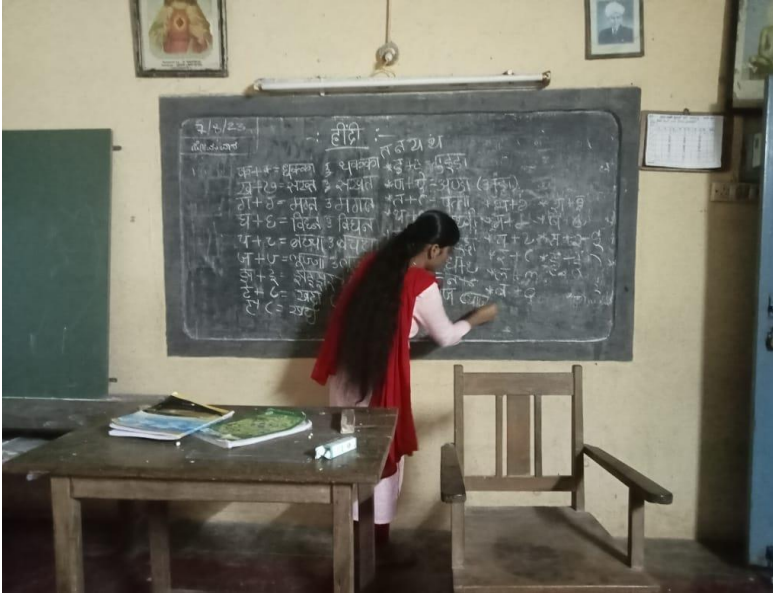
